"Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world."

My Dear Friends in Christ,

We are finishing another liturgical year. I think this year was a wonderful time that God gave us. In this year, we know a little more about our God and He helps us to find the peace that God can only give to the human heart.

I am trying to find the topic that helped me to grow in my spiritual life this year. I realize that acceptance is that topic. When I think about this theme, I find that God is so good in helping me to grow in my peace. When I think that I only need to see the reality in front of me and accept that reality because many times I cannot change it, I find a wonderful peace that grows when I put my trust in God who can change that reality.

During this month, I told you that I am going to talk about eternity. This is a very important topic because this is our final destiny. Today's readings help us to understand who is going to rule our lives and what kind of kingdom we are going to live in. Today in our liturgy, Jesus Christ is presented to us as the King of the Universe. My attention has always been drawn by the emphasis the Bible attributes to the word "king" when applied to our Lord.

If I asked you about the image that you have about the word "king", I am very sure that you have the image that our world gives us through movies and the reality that we see in the mass media. Whenever I think about the kinship of Jesus, I find that the word "king" does have a certain affinity with the biblical language. For instance, when a mother is taking care of her baby and tells him, "You are the king of our home." What is she implying? Just a very simple thing — that her little baby is her number one priority and means everything to her. We have so many expressions that help us to understand that we are not very far from the biblical expression of the word "king."

I believe that when thinking a little deeper on the expressions that we heard and what we mean when we acclaim God as our King, it helps us to understand Jesus' assertion about his kingdom, "My kingship is not from here."

Every single time, when in the Lord's prayer we say, "Your kingdom come", we mean we would like to see that more and more people could find the source of their happiness in God while following the path He shows us, which is the path of love that can draw good from evil. We always need to remember that Jesus' kingdom is never imposed and respects our freedom.

This week, before we began a new Liturgical Year, we need to make a choice. Who do I want to follow? Choosing Christ does not guarantee success according to the world's criteria but assures the peace and joy that He alone can give us.

Christ the King Sunday

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. Let us offer our prayers to Christ the King for the freedom of the Church:

Lord, Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King The beginning and end of all things,

You have made your Church to be a people that bears witness to the goodness and beauty of your kingdom.

By your Holy Spirit, you have united us as one body, called to live as one family of God.

Fill our hearts with your grace, that we would be close to you

by being close to the vulnerable and marginalized.

Give us the patience to share one another's burdens,

And give us the courage to always be friends of the truth.

May we remain with you always.

The Supreme Court is getting ready to hear a very important case involving Mississippi's law to ban abortion after 15 weeks gestation, and it could have a huge impact on, perhaps even overturning, Roe v. Wade. RTL of Manistee County would like to invite your parish to our prayer services being held at Divine Mercy.
